They are a project for after this first manual is finished. If anyone wants to help with this, it would involve having a computer and an Atlantic County Library System membership. All the work could be done from home or at a library branch. I can show you what's needed (basically searching in Heritage Quest by the 26 letters of the alphabet using a wild card and the year 1818 - it's easy). Let's say the first name found in the A search is Adams and there are 3 of them. You simply read each of the 3 applications and see where they lived in the Rev War years. You keep a list of what you found under A names and the area of Gloucester County where they lived. If they are an Eastern section person, you download the file and email it to me. At the end, you email me or snail-mail me your A list so no one will have to spend time doing what you've already finished. The project could be divided up into chunks , such as just A to start, or A through E, so as not to wear anyone out! Call me if you're interested (609-513-1044).
